Respighi, an Italian astronomer, who has also observed the wavy motion from one end of the stellar spectrum to the other, differs in many respects from the conclusions of M. Wolf, and throws some doubt on the accuracy of the theory of Arago. M. Respighi considers that the cause of scintillation arises from real and momentary deviations in the positions of different coloured rays produced by the changing state of the atmosphere, and that when these rays are abstracted from the images of the stars, they would naturally exhibit continual variations in their colour and intensity.
